Answer: As I am recently married, working out what it looks like for me to do ministry as a married person balancing my family will be a different challenge but hopefully it will open up new doors, and opportunities for me too.

Answer: My most significant personal achievement is marrying my wife. But I'm also pretty proud of the fact I'm about to complete my theology degree as a dyslexic engineer who's never had to write an essay before.
