Answer: When I was just 14 I received a calling on my life to go into ministry. The call was clear and a direct answer from prayer. After two years of trying my best to ignore this calling I finally began to pursue it.

What has been a) the most important thing you have learned and b) the most inspiring thing you have experienced during your training? (They can be different!)

Answer for a: That it's not all on me. I can't do my job well in my own strength but only with the power of God.

Answer for b: There is so much more to explore with God. There is so much mystery to him, and so faith should be often seen as an adventure of holiness.

Answer: My hope is to reach further to people who don't know Christ using the digital space through media advertisement. Answer: My wife's curacy is coming to an end this year and so we are discerning where to go next for her Incumbency. Such a large change comes with many challenges but our hope remains to allow us to flourish in her new role as I continue in mine.
