Tell us something about your journey towards ordination?

Answer: I attended church as a child but drifted away in my teens. I returned to church when my eldest child was a baby and became more involved as time progressed. We moved to Buckshaw Village Church as a family 18 months after the church was planted and the more I became involved, the more I felt called to ministry. My training has introduced me to a broader range of church styles and has led me to experience so many new ways to worship.

Answer for a: The most important thing I've learned is that you can't do any of this in your own strength.

Answer for b: The most inspiring thing has been hearing the testimony of so many different people. Hearing people's experiences and challenges that have brought them to where they are today has inspired me to continue to share the wonderful news of the gospel.
