Answer:

Answer for b: One of the highlights of my curacy year so far, has been preaching to more than 200 people at our Easter Sunday gathering before baptising some adults. Also, I have loved the privilege of leading a group in my house and me and my wife have become good friends and now Godparents to some of the group.
